Examination of injured party Hana Salkić

Hana Salkić last saw her son Saib (b. 1975) when they left their house on 11 July. She and her daughters went to Potočare and her husband and son left in another direction in the company of other men from Srebrenica. He was wearing a green tracksuit top and a pair of jeans. She had no information about him until she saw a video footage broadcast by Sarajevo television. She recognized him as he lay down by the road next to Sidik Salkić. She could not bring herself to look at the photographs in the courtroom and became unwell.

Examination of injured party Semir Ibrahimović

The witness last saw his father Smail (b. 1960) on 11 July as he, his mother and his three sisters set out for Potočare and his father and other men took to the woods. He remembered that his father wore a black leather jacket with a blue short-sleeved shirt underneath. He had recognized his father in the Sarajevo television footage. The witness was shown two photographs and he identified his father in both.
